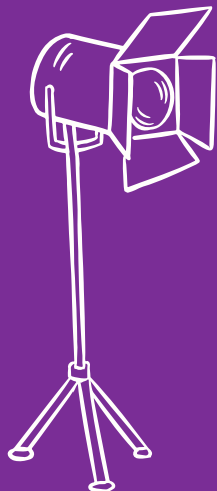


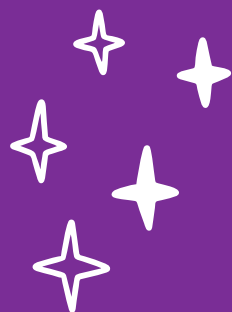

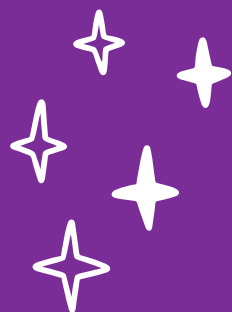
"It's cheaper if you go shopping together with your flatmates, and share bulk items between you all."
